Minister's Comment

I was delighted to be part of the recent Industry Capability Network (ICN) networking event where I announced several key Victorian Government reforms to the Victorian Industry Participation Policy (VIPP).

From 1 January 2013, these reforms will help ensure that local businesses have even more opportunity to gain work in government projects.

For instance, the introduction of a 'contestability assessment' will see the ICN provide Government agencies with a list of 'contestable' items for which short-listed bidders should consider local suppliers.

While promoting opportunities for local businesses, it will avoid the cost of bidders completing VIPP plans for projects that by their nature will be delivered locally anyway.

Another feature is a revised process allowing early identification of opportunities for local industry. This means the ICN can then promote upcoming work to relevant suppliers, helping increase local participation and boosting small and medium business engagement.

Other changes include the VIPP e-plan, an online application process making it easier and cheaper to bid for work and offers dynamic inform assistance, increased security and improved quality.

And a new requirement to complete Post Contract Verification of outcomes will be introduced to give stronger rigor and accountability.

The Victorian Government developed these reforms as part of our Manufacturing Strategy. I encourage you to learn more about these important reforms, by visiting www.dbi.vic.gov.au/vipp and contacting the ICN.

ICN Victoria has been actively supporting local SMEs wins over \$234 million in orders across a variety of business opportunities in Australia and overseas during 2012.

Currently there are over \$300 billion in project opportunities across Australia comprising:

- Australian resources projects of \$268.4 billion;
- 41 Victorian based projects with committed values of \$17.4 billion; and
- Another 59 projects being planned valued at \$16.2 billion.

These projects provide an array of business opportunities for industry. However, the challenge is to be aware of the opportunities and then determine how to best position the company to make the most of these prospects.

Despite the current headlines, mining companies have committed a record \$268.4 billion to 87 major resource projects across Australia. This is made up of 51 minerals projects, 18 gas and petroleum projects and 18 infrastructure projects. ICN can assist.

In Victoria, ICN is working on 5 key strategic projects valued at over \$5 billion – These include the Victorian Comprehensive Cancer Centre, Bendigo Hospital, manufacture of 50 new trams, Melbourne Park Redevelopment and Regional Rail Link.

Case Study - Little Creatures

Originating in Fremantle, Little Creatures Brewery has since opened a venue in Melbourne, and is now currently is in the process of setting up a new brewing facility in Geelong – investing a total of \$60M.

As part of the Geelong project, Little Creatures wanted to ensure local businesses were able to participate where possible. In support of this, ICN's Regional Manager Peter McCracken provided assistance in connecting Little Creatures with local Australian suppliers to supply a significant portion of the process equipment and services required.

Through ICN's extensive Gateway database, Mr McCracken was able to introduce Little Creatures to a number of suitable suppliers such as Ovivo Water Australia Pty Ltd who are supplying the Phase 1 waste

water treatment facility. Other Australian companies participating in the project include Shepparton based company J Furphy & Sons Pty Ltd who are manufacturing over 30 tanks and vessels for the brewery.

Alex Troncoso, Head of Brewing Development said, "the ICN Barwon South Coast office provided an effective means for us to make contact with local industry and build a network of contacts, as well as helped us to feel a part of the local community".

Little Creatures plans to complete construction of its latest edition early 2013 and open to the public a little later in the year. Initially there will be approximately 20 full-time employees at the brewery, with additional local resources used for support areas such as logistics and repairs and maintenance of the site.

Health Care Forum

In November, ICN hosted an industry roundtable session and networking forum in conjunction with KPJ Heathcare – one of South East Asia's leading providers of healthcare, and the Australia Malaysia Business Council.

The forum coincided with KPJ's Managing Director visit to Melbourne.

Six Australian healthcare specialists presented their capabilities in the roundtable session, which preceded a networking function attended by over 40 industry guests at ICN's Melbourne office.

KPJ Healthcare has a network of 21 hospitals in Malaysia and another two hospitals in Indonesia.

The group plans to invest some RM867 million (over AUD \$272M) during the next three to four years to develop new hospitals in Malaysia - namely Sabah Specialist Hospital, Pasir Gudang Specialist Hospital, KPJ Pahang Specialist Hospital, KPJ Specialist Hospital Bandar Dato Onn, KPJ Perlis Specialist Hospital and KPJ Muar Specialist Hospital - which present significant collaboration opportunities to Australian firms.


