Minister's Comment

On 19 December 2011, I had the pleasure of releasing a new manufacturing strategy, delivering on another of the Government's election commitments.

A more competitive manufacturing industry outlines the Government's strategy to revitalise Victorian manufacturing and to support our manufacturers to succeed in an increasingly competitive and rapidly changing environment.

The strategy highlights five policy priorities based on sound economic fundamentals, that will be delivered to improve the productivity and competitiveness of Victoria's manufacturing sector. These include:

- A specialist manufacturing service helping manufacturers overcome market failures and barriers, and raising productivity and competitiveness;
- Productivity and innovation networks providing flexible support to networks seeking to expand their activities;
- Investing in technology supporting businesses to invest in new and transformative technologies that will improve business performance;
- Support for small manufacturers providing more targeted assistance to small manufacturers through specialist workshops, improved access to information and encouraging innovation; and
- Niche and specialist skills supporting manufacturers with a systemic and structured approach to identifying and addressing priority specialist skill needs for key trades.

The strategy also signals a shift towards a more collaborative approach that is highly responsive to the needs of individual businesses. This has translated in the development of a new Business Engagement Model, delivered by business development managers in Victorian Government Business Offices (VGBOs) located throughout metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria. Business development managers can provide tailored information to businesses on accessing State and Commonwealth Government programs to enhance productivity and competitiveness. Where possible, ICN Victoria services will be co-located with VGBOs to provide a more complete service to business.

A more competitive manufacturing industry recognises the importance of high performing enterprises, and commits Government to working with these firms so they can continue to compete confidently with the best in the world.

ICN helps two local Wodonga firms to secure a partnership with German solar tracking giant

Kiewa Valley Engineering Pty Limited (KVE), a regional Victorian steel fabrication firm, has signed a multi-million dollar exclusive deal to locally manufacture solar tracking systems for German energy giant DEGERenergie.

With more than 45,000 systems installed worldwide, DEGERenergie as a global market leader for solar tracking systems was keen to expand its global footprint and tap into the growing Australian market. "KVE, with support from ICN, was able to offer a competitive local manufacturing solution to support the needs of this global expansion program – whilst increasing their employment levels at the same time."

Revitalising Central Dandenong

As part of the \$290 million State Government funded Revitalising Central Dandenong (RCD) initiative, ICN has teamed up with Civilscape and Grocon Constructors to assist in the delivery of Places Victoria's local business engagement program.

Civilscape Director Hayes Heffer says he is pleased to be working with ICN on the project and understands the benefits of having the company on board to identify and engage suppliers to maximise local industry involvement.

"The number and quality of nominees supplied by ICN has exceeded my expectations. Having ICN working with us on this initiative frees me up to keep the project on track." he said.

\$5.2M worth of contracts have been awarded to local companies — including Boral Quarries and TRJ Engineering to complete this project. For Boral this local project represents more than 770 truckloads of rock and keeping 20 men employed. Hallam-based TRJ Engineering was one of the nominated suppliers for street furniture.

In addition to this Grocon will be working on the new Government

Services Building - a \$73M contract that is in the final stages of fit out.

Grocon Project Manager, Andrew Poulton says "ICN has worked with Grocon to develop economic and employment activities and outcomes through the delivery of this project. With their assistance we were able to identify local suppliers who had the capability to supply to our specific work packages and exceed 79% minimum local content as specified in our VIPP Implementation Plan."
