Minister's Comment

Thanks to our diverse industry base and strong and stable economic fundamentals, Victoria has emerged from the global financial crisis leading Australia on key economic indicators such as job creation and building approvals.

The challenge now is not just to maintain the

momentum of the recovery but keep developing new opportunities for Victorian companies, both locally and internationally, driven by assets like our skilled workforce and very strong population growth.

I see this as a central priority for the Industry and Trade portfolio and I am consulting widely with industry about how best to identify and capture these opportunities and build a strong and sustainable industry base for the long term.

To help achieve this goal, we will keep delivering the \$245 million Victorian Industry and Manufacturing Strategy and strengthen a whole of Government approach for industry growth that deals with key issues like skills, infrastructure, sustainable resources and a strong business environment.

This will include continuing to maximise local content wherever possible in our unprecedented investment in key infrastructure which includes desalination and irrigation projects, expanding and improving our road and rail networks and upcoming major projects like the Melbourne Park Redevelopment, the Melbourne's wholesale fruit and vegetable markets relocation and the Hamer Hall redevelopment.

Central to this commitment is the Victorian Industry Participation Policy (VIPP) which has now been applied to over 1,400 projects valued at over \$27 billion and has achieved average local content levels of around 86% and over \$618 million of import replacement.

ICN has played a major role in these outcomes and I look forward to working with it on putting the VIPP and other initiatives like the Transport Infrastructure Manufacturing Scheme to work to give more local companies every opportunity to build their future by helping build the future of Victoria.

RIL Assists Ballarat Businesses Access Major Local Contracts

A number of Ballarat-based businesses have benefited from being registered with Regional Industry Link (RIL) after winning significant contracts with the local council.

The companies won the contracts after being notified of the opportunity to bid by emails that were automatically generated by RIL. The email alerts are a key feature of RIL, which matches the requirements of buyers with the capability of businesses registered on its database.

The projects were listed on the RIL website by the City of Ballarat, which uses RIL to identify suitable suppliers and ensure it engages local industry wherever possible.

Ballarat earthmoving company Midwest Earthmoving won five contracts over several months with the Council after receiving notification of the opportunities from RIL. Midwest Earthmoving ESQ Manager Terry Charlton commented:

"This work has enabled Midwest Civil to maintain our workforce and will have economic benefits for the region with most of the spending taking place locally."
